

Scholarship Information for CAPPS Members

The CAPPS Memorial Scholarship Fund was established in 2004 to honor those who contributed greatly to our sector in California and left all too suddenly. There are currently three deceased members of the Association whose lives touched many of our students and our sector's peers and are associated with the Scholarship Fund. Those members were Bonnie Manley, Sue Fleming and Norma Ford.

The Scholarship Program for 2010 will consist of three Scholarships of **\$3,500 per Scholarship** which must be used to defray the expenses of attending a CAPPS Member School such as tuition, books, supplies and living expenses. The awards will go directly to the Institutions where the students are enrolled and the students will receive recognition at the CAPPS Annual Conference.

Institutional Eligibility:

1. Applications must come from current CAPP's member Institutions in good standing.
2. Applications will be limited to no more than **two applications** per main or branch Campus.
3. Each participating Campus or Branch must select its two best applications ranked on academic performance and financial need and send them to CAPPS via snail mail return receipt requested.
4. The applications must be submitted to CAPPS (555 Capitol Mall #705, Sacramento, Ca. 95814) no latter than close of business on **Wednesday, September 15, 2010**. CAPPS suggests that each participating Institution close off their internal selection procedures by September 8.
5. Submitting Institutions will be notified by CAPPS of the results on September 23, 2009 via email.
6. Institutions whose students are selected are asked to ensure that the student is available for the Awards Ceremony (featuring both Institutional representatives and the Student) on the morning of Oct. 15 at the Hyatt Grand Champions in Indian Wells Ca.

Student Eligibility: Students must:

1. Currently be enrolled or graduated by the submitting Institution by October 2010.
2. The student must fill out the attached application in their own words and submit it to their Institution in a timely manner.
3. Each submitting student must address their academic performance and their financial need in regard to the scholarship. Each area should be afforded equal weight in the review process.
4. Applications should be no longer than two typewritten pages along with a current transcript.
5. Applications must contain no more than one letter of recommendation from an Instructor or individual that speaks to why the applicant deserves the Scholarship.

Allied Health Professions & Beauty Industry Professions:

While any eligible student is welcome to apply for the CAPPS scholarship fund and they will be ranked on the basis of their specific applications, CAPPS recognizes that all three ladies who this Scholarship fund is based on worked in the Allied Health/Beauty Sector. In the event of a tie in the final review process, added preference will be given to those applicants being educated in the Allied Health and Beauty Professions.
